HEDNESFORD NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN JANUARY 2018 CONSULTATION STATEMENT

1. Introduction

1.1 This document summarises the consultation processes carried out during the preparation of the Neighbourhood Plan together with the outcomes, with reference to four other documents which give more detail about the processes and outcomes. These documents are the public questionnaire, summary of responses to the questionnaire, schedule of responses from statutory consultees/landowners to the consultation on the initial Draft Plan and schedule of responses from consultees on the Pre-submission version of the Plan.

2. Consultation on the initial Draft Plan 4th July to 31st August 2016

- 2.1 The Draft Plan was launched by the Town Council at Pye Green Community Centre on 4th July 2016. Invitees to the launch included representatives of public authorities, businesses, the third sector and interested individuals
- 2.2 At the same time a publicity campaign was launched to promote awareness of the draft Plan and to encourage local people to "Have their say". This took the form of press releases in local media, a dedicated page on the Town Council website including a video, social media such as a Facebook page and blogs. This has all been refreshed as the draft Plan evolved during the preparation process
- 2.3 Formal consultation was carried out for 6 weeks during July and August 2016. Statutory bodies and local organisations (listed at Annex A) were consulted by letter. Individual letters were also sent to occupiers of properties that had been identified as being of historical and/or architectural interest. Contact was also made with known landowners with interests in sites identified within the Town Centre and land referred to in Policy H2 (Retirement Scheme, Cannock Road)
- 2.4 The Draft Plan was made available on the Town Council's website and paper copies were provided to inspect at Pye Green Community Centre and Hednesford Library. A press release was issued and a statutory advertisement placed in the Cannock and Rugeley Chronicle weekly free newspaper
- 2.5 A questionnaire was produced aimed at individual members of the public. This could be completed on-line or on paper. In addition to being available on the Town Council's website, paper copies were made available at Pye Green Community Centre, Hednesford Library and supplied on request
- 2.6 In addition exhibitions were held in the foyer of the Tesco store on Victoria Street during July and August where questionnaires were available and also in Hednesford Park as part of the annual Hednesford Festival where questionnaires

were also available

- 2.7 A copy of the questionnaire and a summary of the 219 responses are attached as separate documents with the submitted Plan. There was general support for the draft policies.
- 2.8 The responses of statutory consultees and landowners/occupiers of properties are set out in a separate table accompanying the submitted plan. The table also sets out proposed changes to the plan arising from these responses.

3. Consultation on amended Pre-Submission Plan October 2017

- 3.1 Amendments were made to the initial plan in the Autumn/Winter of 2016/17 and a Strategic Environmental Assessment of the plan was produced by consultants AECOM. This latter document was finalized in June 2017.
- 3.2 Consultation on the amended plan was carried out over a 6 week period from 18 September 2017
- 3.3 The methods used at this stage were
 - Press release in the Cannock and Rugeley Chronicle
 - Statutory consultees, local organisations and landowners consulted by letter
 - Copy of the amended plan available on Town Council website and paper copies at Pye Green Community Centre and Hednesford Library
- 3.4 The schedule of responses from statutory consultees and others, together with the proposed changes made to the Plan to make it ready for submission to the District Council are set out in the fourth document attached to the Submission version of the Plan which was delivered to Cannock Chase Council on Monday 22 January 2018
